Luis Leal Endowed Chair, I created the Luis Leal Memorial Lecture held every year to commemorate the passing of Don Luis Leal, scholar, writer, and one of the founders of the Chicana and Chicano Studies Program in Santa Barbara.

Professor, University of California, Santa Cruz, July 1, 1983 to 2012. Director of the Social Psychology Graduate Program March 2000-2002 and 2003-2007. Director of the Chicano/Latina Research Center 2005-2008; As professor of Psychology, I taught the following undergraduate courses—Introduction to Social Psychology, Chicana Feminisms, Latinos in the Media and the following graduate courses—Feminist Theory and Social Psychology; Survey Methods. I also supervised graduate students in the social psychology graduate program.

Professor, University of California, Los Angeles. July, 1995 to June, 1996; Psychology Department and César Chávez Center for Interdisciplinary Instruction in Chicana/Chicano Studies, Chair: Camille Guerin-Gonzalez, Ph.D. I had a visiting one-year appointment at the full professor level until July 1996 when the appointment became permanent. I taught the following undergraduate courses—Chicano Social Psychology and Latinos in the Media.

Research Director, University of California, Santa Cruz, September, 1992 to 1997; Latino Eligibility Study, Chair: Richard Figueroa, Ph.D. I was responsible for designing and executing the research agenda for the Task Force appointed by former UC President Gardner to increase the number of eligible Latino students to attend the University of California. The Task Force was appointed in 1992 and existed for four years and received a one-year extension.

Visiting Scholar, University of Michigan, March-August 1992. I was awarded the Rosa Parks, Martin Luther King, and César Chávez Visiting Scholar to lecture and teach at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor.

Project Director, California Identity Project, University of California, Los Angeles, December 1988-July 1990. I was in charge of a statewide survey of Latino head of households in California. The purpose of the 1300 sample was to determine what this population foresees as their future in a state in which they will become the majority in the year 2000. This survey was commissioned by the William and Flora Hewlett Foundation.

Research Fellow, Language Use and Language Attitudes of the Mexican Descent Population in the United States. September 1987-June 1988. I was awarded the Research Fellowship for Minority-Group Scholars from the Rockefeller Foundation to write a monograph on language use and language attitudes among the Mexican descent population using the data from the National Chicano Survey and the 1980 U.S. Census.

Research Director, Social Identification, Political Consciousness and Language Attitudes of Chicano College Studies, Pan American University and University of California at Santa Cruz, July, 1983 to June 1984. I collected 600 questionnaires at Pan American University to examine students' attitudes toward bilingualism, level of political consciousness, and social identification.
